

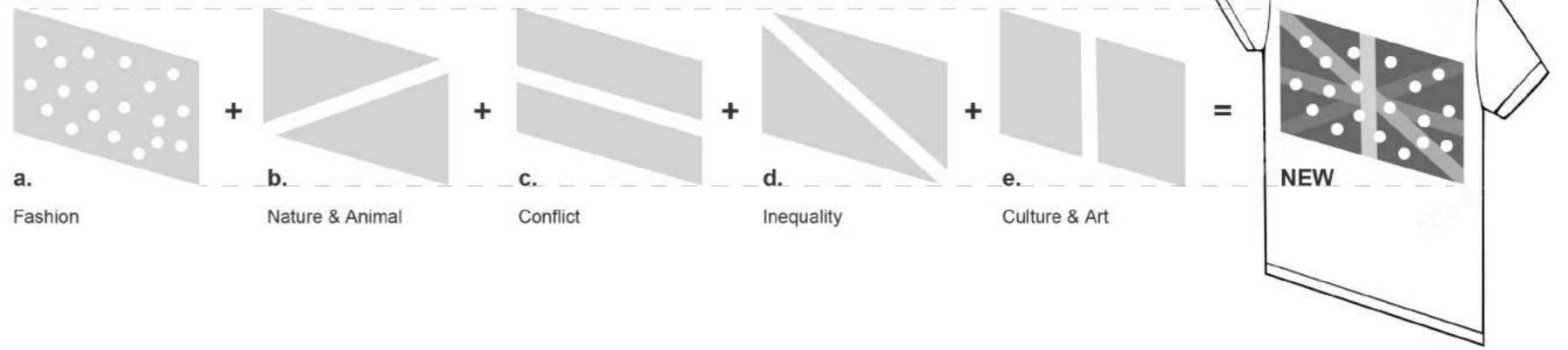

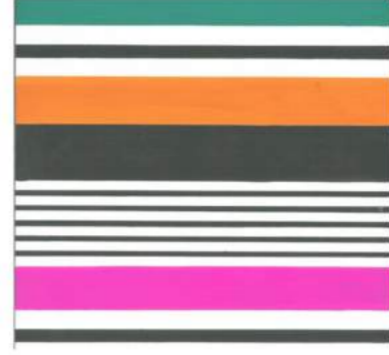

The exotic pattern from India was imported with shawls to Europe and reexamined in fashion world once again in the 20th century.

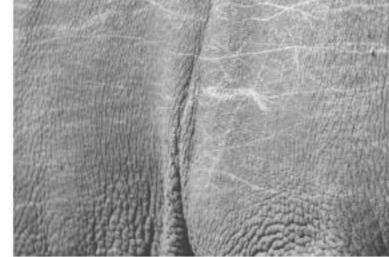


Floral theme has been loved for the numbers of centuries by women. It is used by lots of designers and different design fields.
